Vaccines

- are weakened versions of a disease pathogen that are given to people to protect them from getting the disease later.

-allows your body to create antibodies against the disease

- now memory B-cells will be activated if the virus tries to attack.

Allergies

- an unusually high sensitivity to some substance Called <u>allergert</u>

any substance that causes an allergic reaction. ex. pollen, nuts, cats, dairy...

- severe allergies can cause anaphylactic shock

- body releases chemical called histamine to fight allergen > common symptoms are runny nose and watery

AIDS-Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome

-AIDS is caused by a virus called HIV. -HIV attacks the immune system by infecting telper T-cells

> when other pathogens or antigens enter the body the immune system can't activate Killer T-cells or B-cells.
